Introduction	Mr. Gopi Khanal welcomed the participants and briefed about the main agenda of the meeting. The main agenda of the meeting was to discuss and approve the Policy and Programme Support Facility programme document. He informed that in the spirit of aligning UNJP management structure with LGCDP-II this meeting also considered as LPAC meeting.	
Highlight on PPSF programme document	Mr. Purusottam Nepal highlighted in brief the sources of fund, area of support, management & coordination arrangement, funding arrangement and strategy of Policy and Programme Support Facility (PPSF). He mentioned that PPSF is a programme support facility under the umbrella of the Government's framework for LGCDP II through UN Joint Programme (UNJP) arrangement. Estimated budget of UNJP is US\$ 13.5 million of which US\$ 12.5 million is funded and US\$ 1.0 million is unfunded. Accordingly, UNDP, UNCDF, UNV, DFiD, Norway and Danish will to contribute US\$ 1.8 million, US\$0.4 million, US\$0.4 million, US\$ 8.0 million, US\$ 1 million and US\$ 1 million respectively in UNJP.	

	Mr. Nepal also mentioned that PPSF currently has a funding shortfall of US\$ 1 million. It was pointed out that the new version of PPSF programme document provides scope for innovations field testing in line with other LGCDP-II programme documents.	
Highlight on basic features of PPSF	 Mr. Yam Nath Sharma briefed the committee on formulation principles, basic features, outcomes, budgeting & financing and management arrangement. He mentioned that objective and purpose of PPSF/UNJP is same as the LGCDP II while the outcomes and outputs are different. PPSF supports the LGCDP-II through three pillars/outcomes: 	
	– Pillar 1: Implementation support	
	 Pillar 2: CD and policy support Pillar 2: DBs accordination and OA 	
	 Pillar 3: DPs coordination and QA 	
Discussion	The committee members thanked the MoFALD and UNJP for updated version of PPSF programme document and appreciated that feedback from the first review meeting held on 7 th October had been incorporated.	
	It was pointed out that the Accountability and Civic Oversight Specialist in Programme Coordination Unit and Accountability Expert in each of the six Regional Coordination Units are crucial posts.	
	MoFALD clarified that livelihood improvement plan and local economic development interventions are their priority within the current budget constraints and that these activities will be based on lessons learned from aligned programmes.	
	It was clarified that the budget for pillar III includes one international DP Coordinator and Governance Analyst, a full time national Programme and Monitoring Analyst and a part time national PFM Analyst.	

	It was also clarified PFM experts will be re- introduced in RCUs, but will now be required to be chartered accountants and these roles will be funded by SPMP.	
	It was agreed a capacity development strategy is urgently needed to align and prioritize capacity development initiatives. MoFALD committed to setting up a joint committee that will include LDTA.	
	The committee requested Programme Coordination Unit to share plan on establishing the Programme Recruitment Facility including milestones on transition from PPSF to PRF.	
	It was agreed that the PPSF documents needs to be flexible to adjust to external changes and needs such as the expected completion of local election in the near future.	
	The committee decided to approve Policy and Programme Support Facility (PPSF) programme document.	
	The committee also decided to request UNDP for staff hiring procedure through UNDP, Human Resource Development on fast track basis.	
	Mr Khanal briefed the meeting on the importance of Livelihood Improvement Plan (LIP) in selected districts (preference for terai), and that this initiative should be based on the lessons learned from LGCDP-I, LRP, CSP and others
