Outcome 1:

It was informed that outcome 1 entails three components-PCU, RCU, and Technical Assistance via (DGEs/UGEs) to LBs. The hiring of professional and support staff is almost completed. The recent on-site mentoring of DGEs/UGEs in 11 places showed capacity gaps of DGEs/UGEs. In most of the places, LBs have owned DGEs/UGEs while in some areas more sensitization is needed.

At present, two Monitoring and Reporting Officers positions at RCU and one at PCU are vacant which has created a reporting gap. A mid-level expert with engineering background might be required to hire which needs further discussion.

Furthermore, it was underlined that there are two specific areas which needs further capacity building and discussion

NPM mentioned that a process has been initiated to recruit Engineers through RCUs for 72 new municipalities and pointed out that further discussion is needed to support the 61 new municipalities.

NPM emphasized that AWP budget should at least be provisionally approved due to start of the new fiscal year and salary to be paid to TA staffs. However, substantial discussion will be undertaken in regard to AWP and setting priorities. There are currently two main issues:

- Municipality reform not foreseen while formulating LGCDP II programme document.
- Total TA fund- US\$ 13.5 million needs to be revisited and how to support the new municipalities.

Representative from DP Cell highlighted that the present situation provides two opportunities-

- PPSF AWP 2015 is as per the approved ASIP until July 2015
- ASIP 2015/16 will provide an opportunity to revisit priorities such as new municipalities and others.

Representative from Norway mentioned that new activities should not be added to the PPSF AWP until July 2015 while the ongoing activities shall be principally approved.

- Capacity assessment of TAs (Pillar 1) to be revisited in the new ASIP. Some pressing needs can be addressed or endorsed by sub NAC or NAC.
- New municipalities' plans-issues, challenges to be incorporated in the new ASIP

Mr. Ramesh Adhikari highlighted requirements of new municipalities such as land use plan, transportation plan, and solid waste management. He also explained that office building, equipments, and vehicles are immediate needs of new municipalities. The new Municipalities' need assessment concept note is generic and has to be dealt on case by case basis.

Representative from Norway noted that if JFA funding may support assessment of new

Representative from UNDP however noted that the practical limitations in such a scenario - hiring personnel under UNDP contract by paying NPR 40,000 salary is not feasible and neither a permanent position is possible. 2.
